

What is the LIFE programme?





LIFE is primary EU financial instrument across environment

- Been around for 20 years
- Co-funds:
 - Environmental projects
 - Biodiversity & Nature projects (Natura 2000)
 - Climate Change Action projects
- Objective: to contribute towards implementation and development of EU environmental and climate policy and legislation.
- Used as a catalyst for new thinking, new models of implementation; projects rolled out across EU; delivers EU additionality.
- Small fund, highly over-subscribed!

Who can apply?

- Almost anyone
- Public or private bodies, organisations registered in the EU, commercial organisations. Primarily used by UK Government/Agencies and NGOs such as RSPB
- Overseas Territories and Crown Dependencies eligible but demanding conditionality
- 'Co-ordinating beneficiary' has to be based in EU



Application process

- Annual Call: announcement on 1 June 2015 for traditional LIFE projects.
- Deadline for applications: mid-September to mid-October (depending on LIFE strand).



How are LIFE projects funded?

- A typical LIFE grant of around €1-4m
- Projects often last 2 to 5 years
- LIFE can co-finance up to 60% of the total value of an environment or climate change project (though up to 75% in cases where a project focuses on concrete conservation actions for priority species or habitat)
- Integrated Projects poss funding of up to €10m & up to 10 years, but NOT for marine.



LIFE projects normally must show ...

- 'EU added-value' demonstrating/developing EU policy or objectives
- Match funding LIFE will give up to 60% of total value of environment or climate change project (up to 75% in cases where a project focuses on concrete conservation actions for N2K priority species or habitat)
- Demonstration puts into practice, tests and disseminates methods that are novel or new/untested that can be disseminated and more widely applied
- 'Innovation' applies/tests techniques, approaches key for biodiversity; not used before (across EU), that offers advantages compared to current best practice + capable of EU replicability
- Best practice only for 'Nature' projects ie N2K: state-of-the-art existing techniques for conservation of species/habitats



'Environment' sub-theme...

- Three priority areas:
 - Nature and Biodiversity,
 - Environment and Resource Efficiency
 - Governance and Information
- Includes policy on:
 - Water, Floods, Marine and coastal management, Waste and resource efficiency, Soils, Forests, Chemicals, Noise and the urban environment, Air pollution, Air quality (including EU NEC directive), Nature and Biodiversity.



(...cont) Nature and Biodiversity (priority area)

- Projects contributing to objectives of Birds and Habitats Directives (nature), or EU Biodiversity Strategy 2020
- Areas of focus: Proposals must meet specific thematic priorities in LIFE Regulation. Project topics for Nature and Biodiversity are also set out in the multiannual work programme.
- Typical project: Implementing a Natura 2000 site management plan or actions; testing and demonstrating new approaches supporting EU Biodiversity Strategy targets
- Typical actions: Most geared towards nature conservation, e.g. restoration and conservation of endangered habitats and/or species, and those related to Biodiversity.



Marine LIFE

- Offshore Annex of UK PAF identifies funding needs for Natura 2000 and the wider seas (see JNCC web site)
- Challenges: between 2005-2012 c4.5% funds given to bids with marine elements
- Marine LIFE Thematic report



'Climate Change' sub-theme

- Three priority areas:
 - Mitigation : reduce greenhouse gas emissions
 - Adaptation: increase resilience to climate change
 - Governance
- Specific objectives:
 - implement/develop EU policy & legislation, mainstream activities across policy areas;
 - develop & demonstrate innovative technologies, systems, methods & instruments, transfer/mainstream best practice
 - improve & apply knowledge base in practice
 - develop & implement integrated strategies and action plans



Integrated projects

- New 'big idea' for 2014-20 programme.
- Comprehensive implementation of a strategic plan on large territorial scale (at least 'regional') required by EU environmental or climate legislation
- Limited to nature, air, water and waste (not marine) + Climate action
- MSs entitled to minimum of 3 projects (Environment, Nature & Biodiversity, Climate Action) over 7 year period
- Must mobilise other EU funds to help the project, and ensure supplementary funding for complementary actions on this
- UK currently has two potential IPs:
 - Sustainable Urban Waters (EA- submitted)
 - Peatland Restoration (possible Defra lead)



What can LIFE not fund?

- Actions that should be funded under other European funding streams such as Structural Funds, (eg Regional Development Fund, Horizon 2020), CAP, Rural Development fund (Agri-Environment), Fisheries fund
- Compensatory action under Art. 6 of the Habitats Directive
- Purely domestic objectives LIFE must further EU policy aims or objectives, with a focus on implementation
- General biodiversity projects unless truly 'innovative' including trials/pilots in <u>EU context</u> (outside Natura 2000)



What is Defra doing?

- UK's policy lead, taking overview of bids
- Contracts Beta Technology to act as NCP pl contact them
- Works with ALBs, DAs and successful applicants to boost UK performance by:
 - Using them to mentor and 'hand hold' applicants
 - Developing a longer term strategic pipeline of agreed priority projects that support our natural capital/biodiversity objectives, with the objective of working better together.
 - Developing series of events and support activities via Beta to help applicants
