THE BLUE ECONOMY AND THE DIGITAL TRANSITION | VIRTUAL WORKSHOP

The digital transition will impact blue professions, education and citizens' perceptions and decisions regarding ocean health and coastal resilience. Digital education will have to start in the early school years and continue during all active life. On the other hand, digital tools present a huge opportunity to create inspiring tools for education and public engagement like virtual or augmented reality, remote sessions at aquaria or oceanic cruises and citizen science. The creation of a Digital Twin for the ocean and the availability of open data will also foster the creation of exhibitions and resources to support citizens' decisions regarding ocean health and coastal resilience. The goals of the workshop were to inform and raise awareness about the priorities of the revised Atlantic Action Plan, to promote cooperation between pillars and among countries, to engage with stakeholders and cooperate with other EU programs.
