How can the IMP or Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP) contribute to better social inclusion across EU sea areas? The people involved in IMP sectors often know their own areas very well but are less sure of how they fit in with other activities, especially in different policy areas. Coastal communities along the EU's Atlantic seaboard have significant challenges but can be the catalyst for many good ideas linking land and sea and addressing social inclusion as a key element of an Integrated Maritime Policy and Blue Growth Agenda. To promote such synergies, MSP specialists in the NL Government invented a game for European Maritime Day 2016 that brings together people representing IMP areas such as Blue Growth and Clean Energy with those looking at Governance issues, Skills Development and possible Joint Actions across many sectors and the land/sea interface.
